



A WORD FROM OUR REVEREND... Reverend Donald Kuntz

Seville UMC is in the long green season of growth following Pentecost. Years ago, it was called "ordinary time" (as if nothing special was going on). More recently the year is divided into the half year of our Lord, and the half year of the church (as if Jesus and the church can be separated). Pentecost is when the disciples of Jesus are set loose upon the world. The months between now and Advent are the green season for altar cloths, pulpit cloths and stoles. In the green season, we are still moving outward. We hear the Jesus stories of seeds and feeding great numbers, and reaching beyond the boundaries to help "those people over there."

Advent and Lent are the preparatory seasons (purple), not a count-down because people sit down and wait for a count-down. Preparatory means there are plenty of things which need to get done to be ready. There is much cleaning up to do before the arrival of Jesus, our hearts, our physical spaces, our society. Christmas, Epiphany and Easter are celebratory days, the color white symbolizes joy. Red is used for Pentecost, ordinations, celebrations of the martyrs, and sometimes for Reformation Sunday.

We have just come through Vacation Bible School with its hundreds of volunteer hours. That is an example of new growth: new people in the building, people hearing Bible stories for the first time. The Seville Community Food Pantry is in a period of new growth with expanded hours including the first Monday evening of the month, and a trajectory of more families being served.

The Matthew 25 Outreach food distribution need drivers to make deliveries to the elderly. The Federal CSFP (surplus commodity) box list is 100 individuals. The vegetable delivery list is 140 homes, from Spencer to River Styx (from Medina south to the county line in Creston).

If you can lift 25 pounds and have room in your vehicle for ten or more packages and are available on the second Saturday of the month (between 10am-2pm), please call the church office and let us know what you would like to do to participate in these efforts each month.

The long green season: Jesus said "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come." 

A Message From Bobbi Placke regarding the 55th East Ohio Annual UMC Conference: Theme: Faith Hope Love

Hello,

The 55th East Ohio Annual Conference was held at the John S. Knight center from June 13-15, 2024. There were 316 Clergy and 320 Laity in attendance. In her Thursday morning sermon message Bishop Tracy S. Malone said: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the evidence and the conviction of things not seen. Faith is the solid foundation under everything that holds life together, that which makes life worth living."



After debate the motion was approved to raise three minimum salaries in 2025 to \$49,033 for full members, associate members, and ordained clergy; \$44,065 for full-time local pastors who have completed the Course of Study; and \$41,584 for full-time pastors who have not completed the Course of Study.

Executive Director of Connectional Ministries Rev. Ed Fashbaugh introduced the motion to begin Phase 1 of transitioning the East Ohio Conference to the Simplified Accountable Structure model of church governance. Phase 1 entails creating the Conference Leadership Board that will begin its service on January 1, 2025.

• \$9,500+ was raised during the offering. It is split 3 ways 1/3 All In Community, 1/3 Royal Family Kid Camp and 1/3 Bishop Discretionary Fund. *Continued on the next page*...



- There were 1,000 lemonade packs sold at \$7 dollars a pack to raise enough funding for one young woman to attend African University.
- The Reverend Brian Sheetz director of the Methodist Foundation of Ohio gave us a "To Do List." He said churches have lost the ability to dream. Money is tight and attendance tighter. We need to spend more time dreaming.
- The Reverend Allison Lebrun told us God Never Stops Working. She said "The main thing isn't our job titles or how many hours we serve the church or even the work we do. The main thing is our identities as beloved children of God." She said the race we are running should be The Course Of Love.
- There were 4 church closings this year. The positive side of these church closures is that the funds support Cooperative Parishes such as Arts Place, In the Circle, Go Be, Digital Church Ministry and Thrive 10:10.
- Lakeside Chautauqua has been recognized as a Methodist Heritage Landmark.
- There were 7 Resolutions brought before us. 4 were approved and 3 were not approved.
- 190 youth attended Youth Annual Conference at Kalahari in Sandusky, OH.
- On the first night of the Annual Conference lay members in a special Laity Session elected four delegates and two alternate delegates to the 2024 North Central Jurisdiction Conference. Members were elected to the conference in Sioux Falls, South Dakota
- Clergy Renewal was brought to us throughout conference expressing the importance that our clergy don't find themselves being burnt out during their ministry. It is strongly encouraged they take time for renewal.
- The Anti-Racism Task Group shared about the work it has done and offered an invite for others to join.
- On behalf of The United Methodist Church, the General Conference in May apologized to the victims and the survivors of sexual misconduct for the hurt and harm done to them by the Church. The United Methodist Church pledged to share the apology in every annual conference across the connection, educate church leaders, and provide healing resources. At Annual Conference 2024, Bishop Tracy S. Malone read the apology.
- A Conference budget of \$8,237,340 was proposed for the 2025 budget, this is a 20% reduction from the budget approved for last year for 2024. The goal of reducing our apportioned budget to local churches is to make funds more readily available at the local church so that you can have resources available for innovation and immediate needs. The cost of hospitalization will be raised 1%.
- Reverend Philip Wilden shared a word of encouragement to churches currently working through transition and changing realities. He said his uncle who was a Clergy member would say "Keep on Keeping on".
- The 56th session of the East Ohio Annual Conference will be June 12-14, 2025.

Youth from across the jurisdiction shared in the first NCJ Youth Mission Journey.

Youth and their leaders from Illinois Great Rivers, East Ohio, Michigan. Wisconsin, and Iowa shared at several sites around Des Moines, IA June 23-29. They served with Wesley Woods Camp, Greenfield UMC, the Des Moines Area Religious Council Food Pantry Network, and Families First.

They learned about disaster response and how the United Methodist Church engages with first responders, FEMA, and other organizations to assist communities following natural disasters. They were led in a hunger simulation and engaged in conversation around the difficulties of managing food insecurity. They worked with Midwest Mission Iowa and packed 1600 rice meal packs to address hunger in the world.

And they lived together as one large family for the week, breaking bread, sharing laughter and fun, building relationships, celebrating a birthday, and honored one another's work, as they engaged in God's mission.

More Things To Know



Hints from Seville UMC Members

Tip #1: Dust repellent solution: DIY dust repel cleaning spray. Fill Spray bottle with water, add 1tbs. dish soap, 3 tbs. distilled white vinegar, 1 tbs. olive oil (shake). It helps repel and prevent the build up of dust. And use a lint roller to dust off your lamp shades, Adine.

Tip # 2: Keep cookies tasting great! If you have some cookies that are stale put them in a container with a lid. Add

a piece of bread. In a few hours they will be soft again, Pattie.

Tip #3: These are non-poisonous solutions -For killing weeds, grass, poison ivy, oak, etc. simply mix Apple Cider Vinegar with table salt and a bit of Dawn dish soap. I put mine in a sprayer and it works instantaneously most times. You may have to treat a few times if weeds are bad.

Tip #4: For keeping pests and spiders out and away -simply sprinkle any type of cedar shavings along exterior perimeters as well as pebbled areas as that's their fave. They will steer clear, Donna.

Tip # 5: My mom always used baking soda and water to make a paste to clean scum off tub and shower, Sue.

From the Finance Committee: As of June 30, 2024
