# A WORD FROM PASTOR DAVE ...

## Jesus Said To Them, "Come And Have Breakfast!"

The last chapter of John's gospel begins with the account of Jesus appearing to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias after he had been resurrected. There on the beach, the risen Lord had begun to prepare breakfast for the disciples. As the disciples returned from an uneventful night of fishing, Jesus greeted them and invited them to come eat breakfast with him. Isn't it amazing the lengths that Christ goes to in order to meet our needs, provide for us, and fellowship with us? God's own Son had prepared a fire and cooked breakfast for his disciples. Christ anticipated the disciples' needs. He not only provided breakfast for them and invited them to it, but he himself also divided it among them and put it into their hands. In that culture, to eat someone's food created a bond of friendship. Have you sat at his table? Have you eaten the food he has provided for you? If you have, then a bond of friendship has formed that no one can break.

This entire scene must have stirred Peter's memory and touched his conscience. He must have recalled the first catch of fish in Luke 5:1-11 and how the nets had broken because of all the fish that were caught. Also, seeing the bread and fish may have reminded him of the time when Jesus fed the multitude. The fire of coals would also have certainly reminded Peter of the fire at which he had warmed his hands the night he denied the Lord. How loving Jesus was to feed Peter before He dealt with his spiritual needs. He gave Peter opportunity to dry off, get warm, satisfy his hunger, and enjoy personal fellowship with the Lord. This is a good example for us to follow as we care for God's people. Certainly, the spiritual is more important than the physical, but caring for the physical can prepare the way for the spiritual ministry.

On Easter morning, you are cordially invited to worship with us at one of three services: Sunrise Service at Mound Hill Cemetery at 7:00 am, the Praise Service at 8:30 am, or the Traditional Service held at 10:45 am. You can also have breakfast with the risen Lord in between our Sunrise Service and the 8:30 worship service celebrating the amazing grace of God. This annual breakfast event is hosted by the United Methodist Men's Group. In fact, why don't you follow Jesus' example and invite someone to breakfast and to church. It may just be the best meal of someone's life! Please Note: Holy Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, April 12 rather than on the first Sunday of the month since that is Easter Sunday. Holy Communion will also be offered at the 7:00 pm Maundy Thursday Service on April 2.

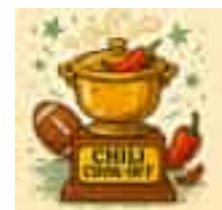

### CAN YOU EXPLAIN PARSONAGE RENT AT 50%?

Glad you asked!

Since Pastor Dave does not reside in the parsonage, it is rented the parsonage to provide additional income. At the recommendation of our District Superintendent, Seville UMC's Board agreed to allocate 50% of the rental income for parsonage-related expenses, with the remainder applied to general operating expenses.

Parsonage expenses such as property taxes, home owners insurance and service for heating and cooling system will be paid for with these funds, reducing the expense that would have previously been paid through the general fund.
